

(1) Hook bolt

A bolt hooked at one end and threaded at the other to receive a nut.

(2) Tie bar

Tie bars are either deformed steel bars or connectors used to hold the faces of abutting slabs in contact. Tie bars are typically eyed at longitudinal joints or b/w and edge joint and a curb or shoulder.

(3) Screw spike

A Railroad spike with a screw thread on the upper part of shank so that the spike can be screwed home after being driven part way in.

(4) Cotter

A cotter is a pin or wedge passing through a hole of five parts tightly together. As in a stream ~~of~~ engine.
